

Vice-Principal, Prof. M. B. Hande [Department of Commerce & Management] gave Speech on "Caste-Free India" on 29/12/2016 for the prosperous India. Prof. Hande gave an example of this important thought by remembering the work of Bharat Ratna Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar., 125th Birth Anniversary of the Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar was celebrated at the UN headquarters by United Nations for the first time on 13th April 2015, a day before his date of birth. with an international seminar on 'Combating Inequalities to achieve Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Prof. Hande said that this is the most recent example of India's hypersensitivity on discussing the caste issue at UN forum. 

5. Report of the event

NSS Programme Coordinator organized programme on "Demonetization Facts and Challenges" on dated 27/12/2016 during the Winter Camp of NSS. Prof. V. P. Hause [Department of Economics] delivered a lecture on the topic "Demonetization Facts and Challenges". He said that demonetization is acts of removing currency as legal tender. The current form of money is stripped from circulation and dismissed in the case of demonetization. New forms of notes and coins are replaced by the old ones. The Indian Government had demonetized banknotes on two prior occasions – once in 1946 and in 1978, in both cases the goal was to combat with tax evasion via black money held outside the formal economic system.

The need of demonetization is essential for preventing corruption and controlling inflation. Poor people expressed their regret on it due to the suffering faced by them. Mr. Hause said that digital transitions of money may increase in future due to demonetization, it may help in reducing the risk of robbery, misplacing of money. He concluded that demonetization was a compulsory step to tackle the problem of black money, terrorism and corruptions activity that prevalent among the people.

After this, Mr. M. L. Bhusare (Department of Marathi) won the hearts of the students by reading his poems. He reads the following poems: 1] Ador [the Farm prepared for Seed Sowing]2] Tanda [the Group Tribal People] 3] Bhuk [Hunger] etc. He is a very famous poet in Marathi language. 



5. Report of the event

Prof. Vinod. P. Rajput [Department of Economic, SSVPS College, Dondaicha] lectured on "Mineral Conservation and Economics" On dated 26/12/16, at evening, He advised that he was also a volunteer and volunteers should acquire the knowledge from various sources. He also suggested to NSS volunteers to attained university level workshop on mineral conservation, so they can create awareness in society about such burning issues. He explained that the environmental issues are increasing day by day, and demand for minerals is increasing.

Prof. Rajput expounds that, the minerals are required in large amount to our body such as calcium, phosphorus, magnesium, sodium, potassium, chloride and sulfur, but some mineral required in small amounts include iron, manganese, copper, iodine, zinc, cobalt, fluoride and selenium. Mineral resources need to be conserved because they are limited. It takes billions of years for them to be produce in nature. Continued extraction of ores leads to increasing costs of extraction and a decrease in quality as well as quantity. He explains the importance of minerals to human body such as our body uses minerals for many different activities, including keeping your bones, muscles, heart, and brain working properly. Minerals are also important for production of enzymes and hormones.

He also told that, over use of mineral not only affects the living organisms but also natural environment of earth. Mineral consumption may increase level of water from earth surface and create alarming situation us in future. Mineral conservation help protect flora and fauna of forest and natural ecosystem; it's interaction within their ecosystems. Assistant program officer Mr. D. P. Sapkale was thanks to Prof. V. P. Rajput for his important talk.


